It's been a year – one long year. From March 2020 to March 2021 we have dealt with a virus that we didn't see coming. This virus affected nearly all aspects of our lives, including our coming together for weekly worship. But you know all those details and I don't have to repeat them. Yet the one thing that hurt the most last year was not coming together on Easter Sunday for the celebration of Jesus' Resurrection! And I believe we can do that safely and with great enthusiasm this year.

Now that it has been a year since this crisis/tragedy began, what have we learned?

1. We don't have all the answers. It came down to three simple rules: wash your hands, wear a mask, and keep a safe distance from one another. I'm sure these measures have been beneficial, but they did not solve the problem. Finally, we have a vaccination which is seemingly bringing some containment. Yet even though we were all caught off guard with more questions than answers, God was not caught off guard. Scripture tells us repeatedly to "Fear Not" and that God has not and will not abandon us.
2. We all have needs. The government has provided financial relief through three stimulus payments and extended unemployment benefits. Our church has reached out through Tuesday meals, a monthly youth home meal, increased food donations to Patchwork Central, and more recently collecting for the children's ministry in Haiti. Philippians 4:19: *And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus.* Yes, we have been stretched, but not broken, and we will come through this all to God's glory.
3. We need to show gratitude – now why do I add this one in the mix? As we begin each service, with the words: God is faithful, all the time! We should actually live this by meaning what we say. Showing gratitude puts the focus back on God's goodness in the little things and the big things.
4. We need one another – I have heard so many stories about loneliness in isolation and not just from those in hospitals or nursing homes. People need contact and encouragement. Without this one can become stagnant and depressed. Jesus becoming human shows his desire to draw close to those he loves by being in a relationship with us.
5. We still need grace – within a pandemic there is much uncertainty and desperation – which can pull us away from God and lead us to sin. Where do we turn? Where/how do we find peace? It starts and ends with Jesus. His grace, forgiveness, restoration is what we can't live without.
6. We still need Jesus!

This brings me back to where I began. Yes, it has been a tough year. Yes, COVID has not gone away. But neither has Jesus, and he was here before any earthly virus and he will always be with us. And EASTER is a celebration of his redemptive love. Friends, he died for all of us!

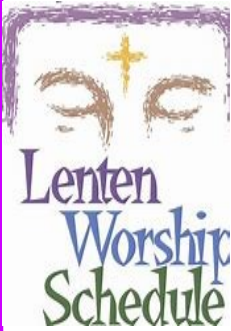

I hope all is well with everyone. February and March (so far) have certainly been a rough time for our communities. Ice storms, devastating flooding, and then a forest fire...it's been a wild ride to say the least! (At this point, I'm thinking about getting volcano insurance!) We have worked with local groups to help those that were affected by the flooding. UMCOR sent over 2,000 flood buckets to our warehouse, which we were able to deliver to several communities, including our own. Tomorrow, Tuesday, March 23, we are opening our Jackson Opportunity Store for the flood victims only. Those affected by the flood will be able to get \$30 dollars worth (each) of items they need, along with food and flood buckets.

It's been a hectic and devastating time. But God is healing this area exceedingly quickly! The Red Cross, along with several other organizations are still here working and helping those recover from the flooding.

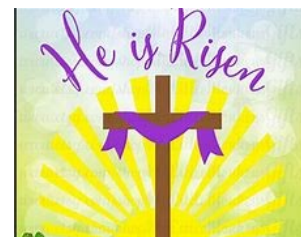
Sunday School is Back!

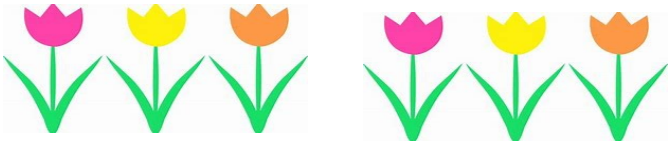

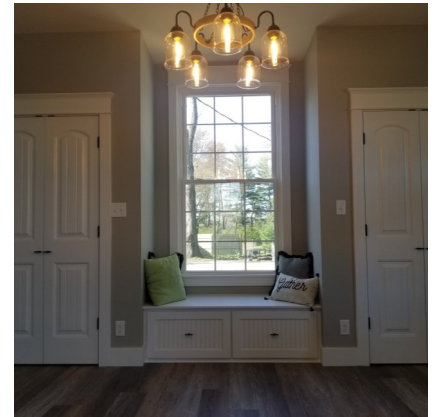
The Parsonage IS almost move-in ready!
