STREET TALK

Unto the Least of These Ministry to Homeless in Evansville

November 5, 2022 Hello everyone!

I want to start out my "editorial" by saying that I REALLY see the Hand of God in this homeless ministry! First of all, I must say that I am SO VERY APPRECIATIVE of all of the agencies, community, and church groups who are doing everything they can to contribute to a positive change in the lives and welfare of the homeless and the poor in our community! On behalf of our people, I want to say a "BIG THANK YOU" to all of you!

Secondly, I am SO VERY GRATEFUL when I see the Hand of God touching ALL of these endeavors. One that just happened to our ministry was that a couple of days ago I received (at home!) a LARGE box of devotional booklets (150 of "Our Daily Bread", current up through Feb.), which I had NOT requested as of yet! AND would you believe it, I had this very publishing company (in Michigan) on my list of contacts to make this very week! Our people DEARLY love to read this devotional. They are always asking for it OR picking it up IN AN INSTANT when they see the box of them right at the door of the van whenever AND wherever we stop! ALSO, the box of Bibles that we keep right next to this devotional are flying out the door at the same time! Everything our community is doing for the homeless and the poor in Evansville is WONDERFUL! As a ministry, we are so very grateful that we can contribute to this outreach by introducing our people to Jesus, the God of the Universe. Thank You, Dear Father, for these opportunities!

Our first stop this last Monday was at "Stepping Forward", a facility owned and operated by the Southwestern Indiana Behavioral Health, which houses and cares for women who have addiction problems, are homeless, have had domestic problems in the past, etc. We make regular stops there monthly to provide clothing, blankets, baby items if needed, etc. We provide Bibles and Christian literature at all of our stops if they would like to have them. This facility was MOST appreciative of all we gave them.

Then, we went downtown to the housing facility where the 75 men were housed who lived in Hope Hall which was destroyed by fire recently. We found out that many of these individuals were released from custody at this site. They still had 28 individuals housed at the new location. A few of the original group were sent back to jail. Once this facility is reorganized and ready for housing of these and similar individuals, we will continue to go back there once a month or so to provide assistance.

On that Monday, a few other stops were made but rain intervened and prevented us from continuing our usual route. On Tuesday, I had a personal delight! My sister-in-law, Debbie, who is in charge of our "Cincinnati Connection" for this ministry, came to town for a visit and brought MANY of the items they make for our ministry-eg. blankets for adults and infants, baby hats, and other items. All of their gifts to us are wonderful to receive! In fact, Breann and I went out on Friday of this past week in my car and distributed the majority of these items to the YWCA, the House of Bread and Peace, and the Ozanam Shelter. They were VERY WELL received! Thank you, dear Debbie, for all you do for the homeless and poor of Evansville. Love you HEAPS!

It seems like to us that we are seeing more and more homeless individuals on our streets than ever before! This last Thursday, we made a stop at one of the "Sober Living" facilities for men on 8th Street. We discovered that there are two sites adjacent to each other for men with addiction problems as well as being homeless, etc. "Joey" is in charge of both of these facilities. There were 14 men at the one where we stopped this week. Joey told us that there are some more of these shelters over on the West side of town-especially for women. We plan to visit at least one of them this coming week. All of the individuals we talked with were MOST appreciative of our gifts and our kindness to them. I want to say here, too, that we pray with anyone we see at any location OR just out on the streets somewhere if they request it. One of our regular team members, Kristin, is in charge of our "prayer team". While we are distributing physical items to our people, she is talking with the God of the Universe regarding any concern(s) they may have. Thank you, dear Kristin, for your faithfulness!

I personally want to add a note here-I am VERY thankful for ALL of our 75+ team members who help us in MANY ways with this ministry. We CANNOT do this alone!

"Unto the Least of These", Matthew 21:40 (Jesus speaking) Ministry to the homeless and poor of Evansville Aldersgate UMC 1-812-477-7816

We stopped at the United Caring Shelter which is one of our regular sites to see if we can help anyone. This past week, there weren't as many individuals at UCS as there usually are. Many of our people will go out and walk the streets after they eat a meal. Or they are inside the shelter taking a nap, laying their head on a table. One person we did see, however, (Michelle) appeared as though she was under the influence of "something". She acted very angrily toward us and immediately walked away at a pretty good clip! I have to be honest with you and tell you that whenever this type of situation arises with one of our people, we "remove" ourselves from the situation as fast as we can. Occasionally, I will call for assistance from staff people on the spot. Also, I have no problem calling "911" if the need arises.......Thankfully, I have NOT had to do the latter......

The Salvation Army is our next stop. We are generally pretty busy there. We have our "regulars" that we see every time. They are dear people. I am SO VERY THANKFUL for the Salvation Army and all they do for people on the streets and in our community. We are so appreciative of the 20 box lunches that their "Soup Kitchen" team prepares for us to distribute further on our route. Thank you, Major Josh, Alex, and the rest of your team!

I just want to add a note here about the women's Bible Study which Sue Moore and Sue Kincaid are conducting every Thursday at the Salvation Army from 12:30-1:30 p.m. This is going very well. We are so appreciative of both "Sue's" and other helpers that aid them in this ministry.

When leaving the S.A., we always look for people and families heading South on Fulton. If we see any people sitting at the shelter in Fulton Park, we always stop and give them one of these lunches provided for us. It appears to us that there are often people sitting there who are inebriated and/or under the influence of "something". We heard that there was some illegal activity there recently and the cops had to intervene. This is not uncommon. Oh, Dear Father, help these dear souls!

Then, on to the Mets Bus Station. As I have said a hundred times before, this IS A MISSION FIELD!! We want to help the people we see there all we can. I must add here, however, that we are always glad when we see a cop sitting there in his car. We have had NO problem there with anyone, thankfully. They MOST appreciate the food we bring from the S.A. and the kindness and help we give to them. One young man we saw at this site just this last Thursday was a recently released prisoner from Wabash Valley "Prison" up North. These individuals get to Evansville by any route they can-one of the main ones is simply "walking" South on Rd. #41. Another way is by bus if they have any cash for a bus ticket. I remember one evening 3-4 years ago when we were serving meals at the UCS on a cold winter night, a young man, just released from the prison, came in and asked if he could have some food. He had NO heavy clothing to wear in the cold. I asked him how he got to E'ville and he told me he had walked and followed the railroad tract from the prison all the way to Evansville. Someone told him about the shelter so he made it over to where we were for a hot meal. By the way, we "coincidently" had an extra-warm, heavy hooded sweatshirt in our possession, so we gave that to him. THAT was of GOD!! Thank You, Father!

It seems like we are always finding new locations for service. One of these this past week was the Line Street Park. We just "happened" to drive by. (NOT a coincidence!). There is a small shelter available at this site. We saw a young man (30'ish) sitting there by himself. He had a lot of what appeared to be personal belongings piled around him. We supplied him with healthy treat bags and bottled water. He appeared to be under the influence of "something". Have no idea just what. We provided all of the help we could for him. We VERY DEFINITELY will continue to stop at that site.

We are SO VERY THANKFUL for the family shelters that are available here locally. The YWCA presently has 40 (FORTY) women at their location, along with some children. The House of Bread and Peace has 25 adults at their site with some children. The Ozanam Shelter has generally around 40+ adults with children at their site. We provided necessary items to all of these sites as much as we could.

I did want to mention one family situation at the Ozanam Shelter. Mom and Dad were both living at the shelter along with their two children. Both parents had lost their jobs. THANKFULLY, they had a safe place to stay at this site. PLUS BOTH parents had just been hired in decent, productive jobs which they were to start this coming week! AND the children are doing WELL! (Ages 5 and 14). Their 14 y.o. son IS EXCELLING in school AND in athletics! We had a regular "prayer meeting of thanksgiving" with this family right there on the spot! We all held hands and thanked THE God of the Universe for being with this dear family! I honestly don't know what else to say here! We were just SO VERY THANKFUL to find a POSITIVE situation such as this in a family at a shelter here in town. We will continue to keep all of you posted on what is happening in this ministry-on how God is working through ALL of our team members (including you) to help our people on the streets of Evansville.

Hello everyone!

As you know, yesterday was "Veterans Day", as celebrated here in the USA. I noticed a statistic that was stated several times on the newscast I was watching. There are approximately 36,000 veterans in our country who are HOMELESS! And I can certainly vouch for several of them right here in our area! We are trying to identify as many of them as possible so we can reach out and touch their lives all we can! I think I told you about "Jim", an 80 y.o. veteran, that we met over a year ago. He was living down by the river under the bridge. Over a matter of several months, he had "moved" himself "inland" a little bit and had since been living in an empty garage over by the Salvation Army. We haven't seen him for a while now BUT have since discovered that he now has his own apartment! We are SO VERY THANKFUL for this positive change in his life AND for all of those who helped him make it!

This brings up another point I wanted to mention to you. We are discovering that MORE and MORE of our homeless friends have NOW been provided with more satisfactory housing such as apartments, many of which have been provided by our local government and social work agencies! We are SO VERY GRATEFUL for that and for the continued work of other groups here in town who are providing decent housing for our people. AND many now have jobs whereby they can earn a decent living. This is definitely an answer to prayer. Thank You, Dear Heavenly Father! On Monday of this past week, we made our first stop over at the "Safe Haven" for women on Franklin Street. We were able to provide many items of clothing and hygiene products that they needed, so this was a blessing. All of these women were MOST appreciative of these donations. While we were serving these individuals, I looked up and saw Matthew, a friend of our ministry from several years back which started when we were serving Saturday evening meals over at the United Caring Shelter. Matthew and I have been buddies for a LONG time. If I don't see him at least once a month, I get rather concerned about him. Well, all of a sudden, there was Matthew standing on the sidewalk smiling at us! We greeted each other with a hug and had a pleasant conversation. He lives out in the woods and has done so for several years. He was walking down Franklin St. and saw the van parked over by this women's shelter. I was SO VERY HAPPY to be able to talk with him AND to remind him that I loved him AND that Jesus loves him! Matthew has a history of practicing pedophilia from several years back. He assures me he is NOT active in this kind of behavior anymore AND has stayed away from any "inticements" to do so. I trust this is the case. I personally think his living in the woods by himself is a means he has to avoid further problems in this area. Oh, Dear Father! Please continue to watch over Matthew and his life.

On Thursday, we made our bi-weekly stop at Patchwork Central. We SO APPRECIATE the opportunity to stop at this site. John Rich and his staff are doing GREAT work for the people who are in and out of their facility. While there this week, I met a man, Jeffery Walker, who is very musically talented! He can play a "mean piano" and has a beautiful voice! Well, I can play a "mean piano", too! So, he and I went back into the building and proceeded to do the above!! Everyone seemed to appreciate our "musical" renditions!! You know, I really WONDER if he could sing in the Evans-ville Philharmonic Chorus?? I don't have any idea what brought him into the "ranks" of the homeless, but he is a VERY talented man! I have probably told you this before, but there is a large church up in Indianapolis that has a "homeless men's choir" that sings at some of their services. Hmm......

I did ask the choir director at my church one time if he has a portable keyboard he would be willing to take to 1-2 of our homeless sites and see what kind of music could be "pulled" out of some of our people. Well, Joe DOES have one! And he said he would be willing to do that!! SO, I'm going to check on this as a talent outreach for our people! I'll get back with you about this!! Stay TUNED!!!

By the way, one of the other men at Patchwork Central has a parrot with him that has been his pet x 12 years! The parrot does some limited talking with you if you choose to go that route with him. Honestly, I can't imagine what all he might say-good, back, or indifferent!! I decided I would back off for the moment! Ha!

At the Mets Bus Station downtown, we talked with another prisoner who had been released from a KY. prison just that morning. He was locked up x 17 months. For ? offense. Was heading back to his home in the KY. area. I asked him about his family-he has 3 small children at home being cared for by his wife. My heart goes out to him and his dear family. Janet and I prayed with him. He seemed to appreciate it very much. We will keep doing this for others likewise.......

We are starting to find more city parks for us to visit to see if some of our people are just sitting there doing nothing. And yes, we are finding them. The park on the corner of Liberty and 6th St., the Line Street Park (corner of Line and Bellmeade), and Garvin Park (North Main). We really need to investigate the South and West sides of town. Will keep you posted on what we find out about those areas.

One final thing-we are finding that we are running out of the following hygiene and personal items for us to distribute to our people out of our van: deoderant, new razors, small kleenex packages, used, clean bath towels and wash cloths, NEW women's cotton underwear sizes 7 and 9, shampoo, bars of bath soap, NEW toothbrushes and tooth paste, combs, and toilet paper. Any time any of you would like to go around town with us in our church van to help our people, please let me know. This is a responsibility that ALL of us have as citizens of this area. Definite positive changes ARE happening to help our people on the street. We are SO VERY APPRECIATIVE of everyone who is helping-with your physical and monetary donations, your prayers, and your thoughts and concerns. Thank you EVERYONE!

Hello everyone!

Hope all of you are well AND are keeping warm! Not all of our people are well OR are keeping warm, so that is why we share this newsletter with you every week. Things certainly change from one day to the next! T The following are some items of interest we thought you would want to hear about.

One day this past week, I made a trip downtown in my car to the Salvation Army to see if I could provide some shoes and other items in need to some of the people sitting around the S.A. building. I immediately saw one young man (probably in his 30's) whom we see on a regular basis on the streets around town. It was very obvious to me that he was hallucinating (secondary to some drug/s and or some mental health condition). I have attempted to talk with him on different occasions in the past, but I am discovering that is it safer for us if we just lay some food and clothing he may need some distance from him and then let him pick them up. I see this young man all over town. Oh, Dear Father, please watch over him. Rebuke satan in his life. And team members, please join me in praying for him.......I don't know his name, BUT God does!!

At the United Caring Shelter, we talked with a young woman who had NO SHOES! (Hers had been stolen! This happens a lot in the population we serve). She just had a pair of socks on. PLUS, it was one of those COLD days outside! She had been unable to get any help from the desk inside the UCS. Maybe they were busy elsewhere-I don't know. Anyway, Terri was able to find her a pair of shoes in the back of the van which seemed to work well for her. We also gave her several pair of warm socks. We tried to get her some social service help that day but couldn't reach anyone. I know they are very busy so occasionally this happens. We gave her the necessary information as to how to get the help she needed. Our prayers continue for this young woman..............

The situation at Ruth's House disturbs us a lot! All of the women who are there (it is generally full-22 in number), have to leave the House at 7 a.m. in the morning and are not allowed to return until 7 p.m. that evening. This situation occurs EVERY DAY! This last week they were out in the cold the entire week PLUS having to walk in the snow the one day we had some. Up until recent months, I would generally drive my car down to this women's shelter on a Sunday afternoon and provide some clothing and personal items to them depending on their needs. Now, from what I have been told AND from what I see, Ruth's House is empty during the day x 12 hours, EVERY day of the week. From 7 a.m.-7 p.m.) This is VERY distressing to those of us in this ministry. Some of these women are staying at this location ECAUSE an abuser is chasing them! BUT, there they are! With NO protection AND are out on the street! Many times I see several of them over at the United Caring Shelter. Usually it's the same 5-6 women who are there (at the UCS). AND, I know for a fact that some of the men who stay at the UCS can NOT be trusted around women! I know this from the past number of years that I have worked with people on the street. This can be frightening for these women, as you can only imagine............(The other 15-16 women from Ruth's House are somewhere out on the streets, hopefully at the Rescue Mission, or in some other place of safety)...................

While at the Salvation Army, we saw a man (living on the streets, age 50 or thereabouts), who is VERY ILL. He is in chronic alcohol failure and is scheduled for a liver transplant up in Indianapolis at the I.U. Medical Center. He also has a HUGE umbilical hernia about the size of a small melon! I am sure all of this can be attributed back to his enlarged liver which results in retained fluid in the abdominal cavity pushing the "belly button/umbilicus" to the outside. All I can say here is that his health future is VERY MUCH in peril. You know, I really believe an entire medical textbook could be written just from the innumerable health situations which the homeless encounter.

I have mentioned "Kiely" to you on occasion in the past. She is in her mid-twenties. She has 3 young children that I know of. This is the young woman who was pregnant almost 2 years ago with twins, got in a fight with the babies' father, and he wound up injuring her BUT also killed the unborn twins. To my knowledge, he is still in jail because of this. The two living children she has are now in the custody of her grandmother. I worry sometimes that this is not a safe situation for them from what she tells me. Well, we saw Kiely at the United Caring Shelter this past week. She is now facing a "felony charge" for some reason. I have no knowledge as to what this is about. Kiely does have a small apartment, so I hope she is able to get a job of some sort and get her life back on track. I hugged her and told her that we loved her AND always will. We also love her two young children and pray for their safety. Please, Dear Father, intervene in this situation with Kiely and her dear family. Because she does have an apartment now, I am comforted in knowing that some of our local social service agencies are keeping track of her and her life situation.

While at the Mets Bus Station this week, I saw a young woman standing alone on the sidewalk. She appeared fearful. I talked with her for a few minutes and asked if we could help. She told me that an abuser is "chasing her" and she was trying to get to the Albion Fellows Bacon Center for safety. She had very little money AND no bus tokens, so I gave her 4 of the ones we keep in our supply for distribution to our people as needed. WELL, this was definitely an emergency situation! I sent her back inside the bus station to get the necessary information she needed AND to purchase a ticket. We are hoping and praying that she is safe. She told me that her young children are "safe" so I am trusting that this is the case. Please, Dear Father, watch over this young woman and her children.

We were involved with SO MANY people out on the streets this past week, we ran out of clothing items for them AND had to return to the church to gather up some more. We are SO VERY APPRECIATIVE of ALL of the clothing and hygiene items that many of you are donating for this ministry. We cannot thank you enough!
