McCutchanville Community Church's mission is to connect our community with God's power and hope through the love of Christ.



In the Church calendar year we are about to enter the period of **Lent** – the forty days leading up to Easter. The term Lent comes from an Anglo-Saxon word which means "Spring." The practice dates from around A.D. 300 and is primarily based on Jesus' forty days of fasting during the time He was tempted by Satan (Matthew 4:2; Luke 4:2).

The three traditional practices to be taken up with renewed vigor during Lent are <u>prayer</u> (looking to God), fasting (looking inward at one's self), and <u>almsgiving</u> (caring for one's neighbor). Today, some people give up a vice, add something that will bring them closer to God, and may even give the time or money spent they would have spent to <u>charitable</u> purposes or organizations.

There are several holy days within the season of Lent.

<u>Ash Wednesday</u> is the first day of Lent in Western Christianity (this year for us on Tuesday night, 2/13). The fifth Lenten Sunday, also known as <u>Passion Sunday</u> (however, that term is also applied to <u>Palm Sunday</u>) marks the beginning of <u>Passiontide</u>.

The sixth Lenten Sunday, commonly called <u>Palm Sunday</u>, marks the beginning of Holy Week, the final week of Lent immediately preceding Easter.

Wednesday of Holy Week is known as <u>Spy Wednesday</u> to commemorate the days on which <u>Judas</u> spied on Jesus in the garden of <u>Gethsemane</u> before betraying him.

Thursday is known as <u>Maundy Thursday</u>, or Holy Thursday, and is a day Christians commemorate the <u>Last</u> Supper shared by Christ with his <u>disciples</u>.

Good Friday follows the next day, on which Christians remember His crucifixion and burial.

Following are some questions that I would like to pose to you about your life during Lent?

- 1. Are you tending to daily disciplines during this time of year such as setting aside a specific time to read your daily devotional, pray for the lost, search the Scriptures for life's daily guidance?
- 2. Are you planning to be in worship and Sunday School each and every Sunday during Lent? Proverbs 27:17: Iron sharpens iron, and one person sharpens another.
- 3. Are you doing some personal housecleaning? We all keep way too much baggage and garbage in our lives, whether it is what we read, watch, play, eat, speak, do... Create in me a clean heart O Lord. Proverbs 27:19: As water reflects the face, so one's heart reflects oneself.
- 4. Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. You get the point on this one, as we ask and need forgiveness, we must also be forgiving without holding back.
- 5. Where are you spending your money? I know I may be meddling a bit, but some of us need to hold back a bit in some areas and be more charitable in others.
- 6. During Lent, make it a point to not just send a card to a loved one on a special occasion, but actually pay a visit to that loved one. We can offer guidance to names of those in nursing homes or shut-ins. For the shut-ins, I recommend calling them first and set up a time for a visit.
- 7. When is the last time that you volunteered to do something around the church or community? Maybe even pick out a specific mission focus for Lent.

My encouragement to you this Lenten season is to let God lead you in some new exciting directions! In Christ,

Plain-du-Nord, Haiti.

There are three regions in the mainland of Haiti:

the northern region, which includes the northern peninsula; the central region; and the southern peninsula. The Plaine du Nord lies on the northern border o the country between Massif de Nord mountain range and the Atlantic Ocean. Richecarde lives in an area where there is a strong Vodou spirit association. An annual festival is held in Plain du Nord and is attended by Vodou pilgrims. The pilgrims bathe themselves, similar to a baptism, in a sacred mud pool "honoring the spirit Ogou". Vodou ceremonies and rituals occur at the mud pool and include the sacrifice of animals.

What is sponsorship by MCC doing for Little Richard?

McCutchanville Community Church has sent money to sponsor two children. We are waiting for the information regarding the second child.

The money for sponsoring each child pays tuition and fees for schooling for an entire year. One uniform, which is worn 5 days a week, is given to each child. The children have access to religious training as well as medical care and general guidance while at school.

Cory Mills visited this area last year. He stated that it is difficult to explain but the small rural towns of Haiti have very little to offer. The town from which Little Richard is from has no stores and no gas station. The church and the accompanying school is the major focus of the entire community in the tiny villages. If the children do not have a sponsor, they are leaderless and have no other option for education and religious training.

As a sponsor, we will be collecting things to send Richecarde as well as the other child we will sponsor. Hopefully we will receive updates from the children and will know more of their needs as we fill boxes that will be mailed to the children.

Please keep Little Richard in your daily prayers and begin looking for items to 'fill a box'.

Mardi Gras, literally "Fat Tuesday," has grown in popularity in recent years as a raucous, sometimes hedonistic event. The name Mardi Gras comes from the tradition of slaughtering and feasting upon a fattened calf on the last day of Carnival. The day is also known as Shrove Tuesday (from "to shrive" or hear confessions).

But its roots lie in the Christian calendar as the "last hurrah" before Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. That's why the enormous party in New Orleans, for example, ends abruptly at midnight on Tuesday, with battalions of street sweepers pushing the crowds out of the French Ouarter towards home.

Pancake Tuesday and fetter Dienstag: The custom of making pancakes comes from the need to use up fat and eggs and dairy before the fasting and abstinence of Lent Begins. So this year we are going to celebrate Fat

Tuesday (February 13th) with a pancake supper. All you need to do is come and eat, and eat, and eat. There will be pancakes, sausage, milk, juice and coffee. This year any profit from this event will go to our Vacation Bible School program.



Our youth will once again serve us a Fat Tuesday Pancake Supper from 5:00-6:30 PM in the Fellowship Hall. We will be taking a freewill offering for this summer's VBS. The menu will consist of pancakes, sausage, milk and juice.

Lent 2018 kicks off on Wednesday, Feb. 14th.




